"Funding Dreams: Grants of Up to \$5000 Await Young Central Coast Artists!"

Grants up to \$5000 are available to young Central Coast artists wishing to pursue a career in the Arts. Applications are now open and close on 3 June.

In its 14th year of grants, mentorship, and encouragement to young artists, The Bouddi Foundation for the Arts has awarded over 230 grants totalling more than \$465,000. Previous grant recipients have used their grant for equipment, tuition, studio time, overseas study, publicity, and more.

Young Central Coast artists aged 15 - 25 (up to 30 in special circumstances) in any artistic field are encouraged to apply. Applicants are eligible if they live, work, or have a meaningful connection with the Central Coast (e.g., grew up here, etc.)

Artistic genres include visual arts, photography, filmmaking, singing, dance, song writing, poetry, sculpture, creative writing, drag artists, indigenous dance, acting, scriptwriting, screenwriting, luthiers, opera singers, ballet, digital artists, voice artists, theatre, tap dancing, big band, storytelling, playwrighting, museum curating ... and so much more.

Elana Sydenham - flautist: "it changed my life."



"The Bouddi Foundation for the Arts has changed my life, it has given me the chance to pursue music as a career. The day I auditioned, I was nervous playing with my broken flute.

Thanks to the generosity of the donors, within weeks I was playing on a

professional flute. With the Haynes Q3 flute I haven't looked back, taking every opportunity to grow and develop my music skills further. I am so grateful and feel honoured to receive the Foundation's Coles Danziger Award."



Macyn Van Borssum – tap dancer: "The Bouddi Foundation grant has been amazing"

"From age 6, all I ever I wanted was to be world junior tap champion. The Bouddi Foundation grant has been amazing, it has covered competition fees, tap shoes, a tap floor

and competition outfits. At the Australian Tap Championships I won the Solo title, best performer prize, made the national team and in October fly to the World Tap Championships in Prague to compete for the World Tap title."

"I've been working with the Props and Scenic Art teams at Opera Australia on shows such as The Magic Flute, Westside Story, La Traviata. I am enjoying my professional life after NIDA. I would never have been able to do any of this without
